In order to make progress towards the goal of ending homelessness, it is imperative that communities invest in interventions that are both effective and cost-effective. Since the majority of HUD McKinney-Vento funds are used to fund renewal grants for existing projects, it is critical that each CoC review its portfolio of existing projects annually to determine if those projects are effectively meeting the needs within the community. During the annual CoC competition, HUD allows CoCs in Hold Harmless Need status to reallocate funds from existing Supportive Housing Program renewal projects to create new permanent housing projects and/or new HMIS projects.
